There are a few important questions chapters should think about as proposals are developed:

Why is this project a priority?

- o "Internal" vs. "External" state projects how these are defined matters
- Projects must address desired conditions of the Vermont Trails & Greenways Plan (see link below)

- o To develop critical linkages between sections of trail what will this accomplish?

Be sure to highlight the benefits to your community and visitors!

- Developing community, connection to place, and commitment to stewardship
- o It's healthy, family friendly, and an opportunity to make genuine connections with the town through youth programs, chapter outreach and so on

Management considerations for the long-term

- Importance of trail building clinics and the use of best practices (IMBA standards are a central trail element in the MOU between VMBA and the State)
- What resources are available at the local level for trail stewardship? Access equates to a lot of commitment and work – does the proposal articulate how the chapter will steward more mileage?

Mapping

 Maps that clearly indicate topography, trail locations, water locations, known animal routes, other trails, and management/ownership boundaries are critical

Timelines & Budgets

- A timeline incorporating clear and realistic building ambitions is helpful. Utilize the mapping to help clarify building/maintenance priorities.
- Budgets should reflect a holistic view of the expenses associated with trail work including, but not limited to: professional trail design, rentals, materials, etc.
