2020 Accomplishments:

- Contracted with Pete Wakeling, OTB Trail Builders to complete Phase Two of our three phase plan.
 - Added 2+ miles of intermediate trail around the Montgomery Rec Center
 - Scheduled for 2021: Additional skills trail and School to Town trail connection.
- In conjunction with the Jay Community Rec Center board and the Northwoods Outdoor Center, rehabilitated, re-routed and built bridges through the Jay Rec Center.
- Implemented annual sponsorship campaign.

- 2020 Season in Review
 - Three-person Pro Trail Crew maintained 7 trail networks all season long
 - 2,978 combined hours
 - Most members ever 1,875!
 - New Kessel Run trail at Sleepy Hollow
 - Reclaimed Homestead trail at Hinesburg Town Forest (HTF) after logging operation
 - Overhaul of Maiden, Sheep Thrills and Russel's Ramble trails in the HTF
 - Resurrection of old Arcana network in Jericho
- Looking Ahead to the 2021 Season
 - Return of group rides and traditional events (fingers crossed)
 - More new trails at Sleepy Hollow
 - New novice/intermediate trail at HTF (tentative)
 - Skills zone and features for kids and novices at Sunny Hollow in Colchester
 - More trails closer to population centers and between networks

- Little River Refresh
 - The flowy genius, Tom Lepesqueur, performed a full refresh on a number of problem spots
 - Somehow, it's even MORE fun
- Joe's Trail Historic Preservation Fueled by the Burton Trail Grant!
 - Long-term sustainability improvements performed by Knight Ide & Crew
 - Featured the robust rock work wizardry he (and Joe's) is known for
 - Burton volunteers came out multiple nights to help the cause
